



## **Shower Enclosure Cleaning Information**

**Shower enclosures provide a stunning modern finish for your bathroom and are relatively easy to keep clean. Use these tips to keep your glass shower enclosure spotless and flawlessly clean with ease and simplicity.**

**Keep Your Bathroom Ventilated:** One of the best things you can do to keep your shower enclosure in its best condition is to keep the bathroom, as well as the door itself, as well-ventilated as possible. Proper ventilation of the enclosure helps prevent potential damage and growth of mold and mildew.

Remember to keep a fan on, and always keep your shower door open for at least 15-20 minutes post-shower to allow for proper ventilation. An added measure would be to keep a bathroom window ajar during your shower.

**Squeegee Everyday:** Taking a few minutes after each shower to squeegee your enclosure is a quick and simple way to keep the glass looking its best. Try applying light pressure from top to bottom, starting in the corners of the enclosure. If you would prefer not to use a squeegee, a cotton or microfiber towel may be used in its place. Remember to never use any abrasive materials on your glass enclosure.

**Household Cleaner:** Do not use abrasive or acid-based cleaners when cleaning your shower enclosure. Abrasive or acid-based cleaners can scar the metal or glass of your enclosure, especially with prolonged use. A 50/50 mixture of water and vinegar is a perfect solution for glass maintenance; add a little Dawn dish detergent for tougher stains. A brand name cleaner can be recommended by your sales contact.

### **Care and Cleaning of Shower Hardware:**

- Wipe any water off the shower metal with a clean dry cloth after each shower
- Use a soft clean cloth, bristle brush, or sponge and a neutral/mild cleaning liquid or warm soft water to clean hardware. Never spray any cleaner into hardware crevices as this causes corrosion.
- Be careful not to scratch the surface of the hardware during cleaning. Do not use a cleaning mixture containing bleaching ingredients/chlorine
- Do not use any steel wool or other abrasive tools
- Always rinse the surface with soft clean warm water after cleaning with detergent & wipe dry
